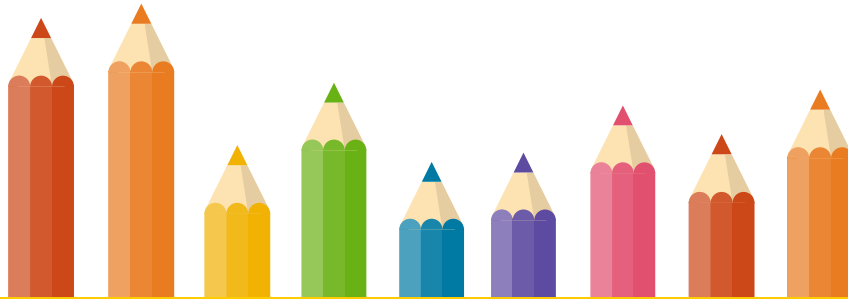


1. Key Ideas and Details

- requires the reader to locate and cite explicit information in the text
- questions could be multiple choice, true/false, matching, short answer, fill in the blank



Levels of Questioning



2. Craft and Structure

- requires readers to analyze how the author developed and structured the text.
- asks readers to look for ways the author used figurative language and word choice
- questions could be multiple choice, T/F, matching, short answer, or fill in the blank.

3. Integration of Knowledge and Ideas

- requires the reader to evaluate the text in several ways: compare/contrast, analyze, etc.
- These questions are in an essay or written format, they are extended responses.
